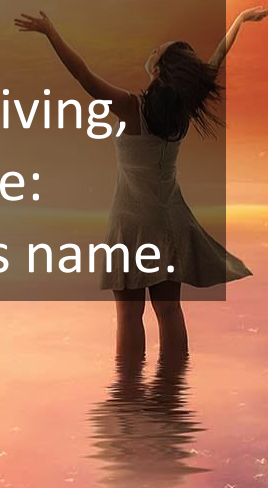


ON REPEAT

Psalm 100 ISV

The psalm includes seven commands—all plural...

¹ **Shout** to the LORD all the earth!

² **Serve** the LORD with joy.

Come before him with a joyful shout!

³ **Acknowledge** that the LORD is God.

He made us and we belong to him;
we are his people and the sheep of his pasture.


⁴ **Enter** his gates with thanksgiving
and his courts with praise.

Thank him and **bless** his name,

⁵ **for the LORD is good**
and **his gracious love stands forever.**

His faithfulness remains

...and closes with three foundational reasons God's people can be thankful.

Shout to the LORD all the earth!

As soon as the people heard the sound of the trumpet, the people shouted a great shout, and the wall fell down flat....

Moses and Aaron entered the meeting tent.
