

While Peter was still saying these things, the Holy Spirit fell on all who heard the word. ⁴⁵ And the believers from among the circumcised who had come with Peter were amazed, because the gift of the Holy Spirit was poured out even on the Gentiles. ⁴⁶ For they were hearing them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Acts 10:44-46 ESV

...they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. ⁶ And when Paul had laid his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came on them, and they began speaking in tongues and prophesying. Acts 19:5-6 ESV

Is speaking in tongues *the* "clear and unmistakable" evidence of being baptized in the Spirit?

Tongues is not mentioned as a manifestation in every account of the baptism in the Spirit in the book of Acts. Then they laid their hands on them and they received the Holy Spirit. Acts 8:17 ESV


And laying his hands on him he said, "Brother Saul, the Lord Jesus who appeared to you on the road by which you came has sent me so that you may regain your sight and be filled with the Holy Spirit." Acts 9:17 ESV

And the disciples were filled with joy and with the Holy Spirit. Acts 13:52 ESV Tongues is not mentioned as a manifestation in every account of the baptism in the Spirit in the book of Acts. There is no direct statement in Scripture that establishes tongues as *the* evidence of baptism in the Spirit.

Church history is filled with those who were obviously baptized in the Spirit, yet did not speak in tongues.

Duncan Campbell, *Revival In the Hebrides* "And suddenly, the power of God fell upon the congregation.... one side of the church threw their hands up.... Threw their heads back and you would almost declare that they were in an epileptic fit, but they were not. Oh, I can't explain it. And the other side they slumped on top of each other. But God, the Holy Ghost moved. Those who had their hands like this stayed that way for two hours. Now you try to remain like that with your hands up for a few minutes and you will find it hard – but you would break their hands before you could take them down. Now, I can't explain it – this is what happened." "That is God at work. Miracles, supernatural, beyond human explanation. It's God!"
